New Captain of the Port of Cartagena assumes.



In a military ceremony presided over by Vice Admiral Juan Francisco Herrera Leal, Maritime General Director, the Captain of the Port of Cartagena was replaced, a position that from now on will be held by Captain Darío Eduardo Sanabria Gaitán.

Captain Sanabria, a physical oceanographer by profession, graduated from the Almirante Padilla Naval Cadet School in 1997; Recently, he served as Director of Institutional Projects of the National Navy, and, throughout his military career, he has been linked to the General Maritime Directorate (Dimar), as coordinator of the planning group, commander of the oceanographic ship ARC 'Malpelo', Captain of the Port of San Andrés and second commander of the oceanographic vessel ARC 'Providencia', among others.

The Port of Santa Marta has 4 cold rooms with independent platforms and temperatures, modern monitoring and inspection systems, truck leveler, LED

lighting for 24-hour work and electronic control boards that allow the conservation of products such as flowers, avocados, Cape gooseberries, gulupas, potatoes, meats, lemons, fruit pulp, among others.



Refrigerated cargo volumes

Thanks to its infrastructure and services, in 2019 39,463 refrigerated cargo containers were mobilized through the Port of Santa Marta compared to 19,539 dry cargo containers, which indicates that 67 percent of the mobilized products were perishable, refrigerated or frozen.

In the course of 2020, despite the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic on the global market, the movement of refrigerated cargo through the Samaria maritime terminal maintained significant volumes. In fact, between January and October 34,300 refrigerated cargo containers were moved.
